Standing Committee Report – April 2009

The following is a brief report of all the main points from the meeting.

General.

Although Spain is already a Section within EFSA, the Catalan area of Spain is looking to form a separate Section.

Section France is hoping to become more proactive.

Following all Championships, HQ wish to have any photographs taken sent to them

David Styles submitted a paper for discussion that included the following.

Item 1; All Sections to translate EFSA rules into their native language so that at any event, any objection can be referred to by rule number -allowing clearer communication. Item 2: A standard form for handling of protests at a boat event.

Not a lot on Shore events as Phil Lustig unable to attend meeting and no report received.

Events

2009 Boat and Line, Scotland 139 confirmed entrants. Pollock limit increased from 5 to 10. Everyone will have an updated brochure at registration and boat draw scheduled for 9th May with details being sent to Secretaries. There is a good tackle shop in Stromness which will open early to late. **The Scrabster to Stromness ferry requires a photo ID.** Any clothing ordered will be available for collection at registration. Orders taken at registration will be ready during the week. Names can be embroidered on clothing if requested.

2010 Boat and Line, Delvik, Iceland Brochure available in summer 2009. Coalfish, cod and haddock limit of 25 - other species limit of 5. Boats will be mostly larger wooden ones fishing each side as a separate boat (so 2 x 100% per boat). There will be a designated person to assist with accommodation.

2011 Boat and Line, Weymouth.

Nomination to host this championship by EFSA England accepted.

2012 Boat and Line Norway

Not much detail at this time with 3 possible venues. Section preference to John-Eric Roth by 1st June. English Section preference is Stavanger where first Championships were held 50 years ago come 2012.

2009 Species conger, Plymouth - Details given

2010 Species, Albufeira, Portugal

Species will be bream scored by weight, 2 hooks only. Entry cost 200Euro includes 2 days fishing, bait and breakfast on the quay prior to departure. Gala dinner 50Euro

2011 Species Germany have nominated to host out of Langeland, Denmark fishing for flatfish in either October or November.

2009 Shore, Langeland, Denmark Section Germany hosting. Cost 250Euro, 7th to 14th November. Bait - ragworm. Will need Danish fishing licence that can be bought just for the week

2010 Game

Thailand was voted against as a venue. Proposal and costing for new venue prior to meeting in Stromness in August.

We are now half way through the year and the change in format to determine the best fish of the year has had a mixed response with most support coming from our Affiliated Clubs. However, some fine fish have once again been recorded.

On the Overseas Fish of the Year, Ivan Wellington and Jim Whippy have seen some superb action with Ivan boating a 120 lb Stingray in the Gambia, and Jim landing a 400lb Goliath Grouper - the largest of a number of heavyweight specimens caught from the waters off Florida.

On the domestic front, S Hooper from the Cornish Federation leads the Juniors with a Whiting of 4 lb 6 oz, whilst a Stingray of 47 lb 11 oz caught by Andrew Wenden (West Wight Club) from the shore, is a major contender for the Norman Witt trophy for best fish of the year. Regular angler Paul Hart currently leads the way with a 70lb Eel to put him ahead in the race for the BCC Tankard for best Conger.

Membership Registrar's Report

Current EFSA England Membership: 78 Life members

I have little to report that was not included in my AGM report so I have decided to respond to questions that I am frequently asked.

a) Why does my Membership number start with 5/---?

Answer: 5 is the England Section number. Each country has a Section number that emanated from EFSA HQ - and ours is 5

b) If I am a member of an affiliated club but I am not a Member of EFSA England myself - can I fish the EFSA competitions?

Answer: Yes you can, any member of an EFSA England affiliated club, of which there are at present seven (see list below), can fish any EFSA England competitions including European Championships and Species Championships. The only caveat is that if you were to win a pin event and duly received first prize you would not be entitled to the gold pin, as only Personnel Members are eligible to win pins so the gold pin would be awarded to the second place and so on.

c) I am now a Life Member, but since becoming a Life Member I no longer receive a Membership Card each year. Why?

Answer: Once you become a Life Member you are issued with a new Membership Card containing your Life Membership number. After that no Life Member receives a yearly Membership Card, as there is no need to verify that you have paid each year. If, however, you have mislaid or forgotten your Life Membership number then I am quite willing to send out a new one to anyone who requests one, not forgetting the stamped addressed envelope.

d) When am I eligible for Team selection?

Answer: All anglers seeking Selection shall be fully paid up Members for at least 12 months continuous duration for consideration for team selection. Please note that Membership subscriptions are due for renewal by the 1st January each year. However, the Committee has relaxed this ruling and have extended this renewal date up to and including the day of the AGM for those seeking Selection. For newer Members the duration of continuous Membership will count up till the commencement of the event. Anglers, who have previously represented another Sections, must undertake a period of one year free of representing any Section to re-qualify for consideration.

e) When is a junior no longer a junior?

Answer: A junior will remain a junior until the age of eighteen. As such, the parent or guardian shall be responsible and liable for the junior's actions and safety at any EFSA event at all times until that age.

f) How do I start a new standing order for my Membership renewal?

Answer: Fill-in the Membership renewal/application form as you would normally but adding the words'new standing order' and send it to me. Then fill-in the standing order form and take it to your own bank. Both forms are contained within the newsletter.

Just to conclude - all the above and more are contained within the English Section Constitution & Protocols and you should all have a copy. It is also on our website www.efsa-england.org.uk and available from me if required - not forgetting (as always) the stamped addressed envelope (A5 size).

Gary Galbraith Membership Registrar On the evening of 28th May at The Royal Western Yacht club the registration and welcoming ceremony were held for the 2009 Species Championship. This gave competitors an opportunity to renew old friendships over a drink and to put forward any questions after the official opening ceremony so as to clarify rules and timetable for the 2 days fishing.

Day 1 and the 71 competitors from seven Sections mustered prompt at 0700 with expectations high of the possibility of hooking into that big-un. Weather was dry but with a stiff breeze from the East which meant wind over tide for most of the day. Boats headed for their favourite piece of rough ground as anchoring a wreck with these conditions was nigh impossible, though the last couple of hours with the turn of tide some boats did anchor a wreck. All boats found conger but not all anglers. Most eels were between 10 and 30 pound with the best of the day to Paul Hart with one of 70lb. Top anglers on the day joint on 100 fish points were our very own Andy Selby and Alexander Gusev from Russia.

Day 2 and the wind had increased to a 5+ so it was therefore declared to fish reef only. As the day before, the effects of wind and tide meant that the usually beneficial stern draw resulted in fishing under the boat for most of the day. Not that anyone had it easy as the boats were continually swinging on the anchor. I was fortunate to be on Sea Angler and Malcolm the skipper put us on a productive area of rock which saw 54 eels caught and released. This was the top boat on the day and overall top boat with 94 congers. Also glad to be on that that boat was Ray Barron who pulled up 13 eels for 100 points and won the day.

On the Saturday evening the presentation was held at The Royal Western Yacht club - a nice venue with good food - though a bit tight on space with the numbers attending. Despite this, everyone was in good humour and enjoyed themselves.

As for the results, the day 1 winners failed to add to their score which resulted in Ray Barron's 20 from day 1 plus 100 from day 2 put him as overall winner and gold pin. 2nd and silver pin was Takhir Ahyautdinov from Russia on 105 points and 15 fish, and 3rd and bronze pin was Mick Clarges of Ireland on 105 points and 12 fish. It was good to see the honours spread amongst different Sections.

International team winners were England A team of R.Barron, G.Galbraith, P.Hart, S.Clements, M.Smith.

English Boat Championship $2009 - Rhyl - 20/21^{st}$ June

Registration took place at the Headquarters venue at the Sunnyvale Caravan Park.

Most of the 66 entrants from England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland and Germany registered on the Friday evening, followed by socialising and catching up with friends not seen since the last competition.

Day 1 had to be cancelled due to the wind strength and direction but there were fish caught by the dozen or so for those who decided to change discipline and have a go off the shore. A wind farm was built offshore at Rhyl several years ago and about 8 miles down the coast, another wind farm is under construction. It occurred to me that the common theme here to power the turbines is wind. So I ask myself, should we be cautious in booking a venue with a wind farm nearby!

Day 2 and a change in the weather and we headed out for what had to become a one day comp instead of two. Seven boats put to sea for 71/2 hours fishing - a bit longer than usual due to the harbours drying out, so boats have limited state of tide for getting onto the jetty.

Most boats found some good size Tub Gurnards for which Rhyl is renowned, the best going to the rod of Dave Oliver with one of 55cm estimated over 5 lb. Dabs are the other prime species with several competitors getting their 10 and then some. Also making up the catches were Red and Grey Gurnard, Dogfish, Smoothhound, excessive amounts of small Whiting, Mackerel and double figure Bull Huss. A good days fishing was had by most with all regretting only fishing the one day.

When the points were worked out there were seven boat winners on 100% so it was necessary to use the count back. The top tw had the same 84 points, so first and second was decided by the number of fish caught – one having 50 and the other 43 fish - a close result.

The top three and pin winners were, 1st and Gold pin to Rolf Marshalek of England, 2nd and Silver pin to Paul Hutchinson of Ireland, with 3rd and Bronze pin going to Arran Smith of Wales.

Top Junior was Sam Short of England.

2009 European Shore Championships Langeland, Denmark 7th -14th November
