### **EFSA England Species Festival (Flatfish) Weymouth 2017**

The annual EFSA England Species Festival was fished form Weymouth on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> of April with flatfish and rays as the target species. At registration on Friday it became clear from the chat that the rays were not around in any numbers and very few plaice so turbot and brill would be the main quarry.

Day one saw the anglers, including friends from the Belgium, and Netherlands Sections, muster for their boats at 7:30 with the weather gods being reasonably kind although the NW wind put a chill in the air and would not provide the best drifting conditions. All five boats headed for the Shambles and most were fishing by 9 o'clock. On boat Amarissa, Ray Barron was soon into a turbot to establish a lead which he maintained for the rest of the day. During the morning Jim Phillipson tried to challenge him for an hour or two but by lunchtime Ray had five fish. As the afternoon wore on there was a late charge from Richard Wheeler but Ray found another two turbot to end the day with seven fish for 560 points and top rod for the day. Richard had five fish and Jim four. The rest of us were also rans with two anglers failing to catch.

On Supa Nova, Ken Smith took the honours with five fish for 378 points. On Snapper, Rod Adamson had three fish for 221 points. On Top Cat it was Andre Machiels with 2 fish for 144 points and on Al's Spirit birthday boy Andy Selby took the top spot with two fish for 116 points.

Day two was fished in bright but windy conditions. Most boats opted to drift for most of the day, except for Snapper which decided to anchor and try for rays as well as turbot. Although this was reasonably successful with all anglers catching at least one fish, the rays were small and at one point per cm wasn't going to put a lot of points on the board. Kim Bowden took top spot with 3 fish for 206 points.

Day one winner Ray Barron on Wild Frontier found three fish for 224 points to ensure he kept his overall lead although it was John Filsel who won the boat with six fish for 456 point to take him to 6<sup>th</sup> place as he had failed to find a fish on the first day. On Al's Spirit John Little won the boat with five fish for 375 points which took him into 4<sup>th</sup> place overall. Jim Phillipson managed another three fish which, together with his four on Day One, took him into 3<sup>rd</sup> place with a total of 518 points.

Meanwhile on Top Cat, our Chairman Neil Bryant excelled himself catching the longest flatfish of the competition - a fine turbot of 12lb 8oz in his catch of five fish for 484 points. These together with his one fish from the day before took him into second place with 558 points. Martin Bobbett had a 52cm long brill weighing in at 4lb 2oz. Gary Geoghan was the star on Supa Nova with five fish for 376 points taking him into 5<sup>th</sup> place overall.

The presentation was held at Weymouth Angling Club where Ray Barron had the gold pin pinned to his jacket as a worthy winner. Neil Bryant won the silver pin and Jim Phillipson the bronze pin.

Top Senior was Jim Phillipson. Ray Barron took the Life members prize. Andy Selby, Neil Bryant and Ray Barron supported Perry Dack, who failed to find a fish, to win the 4 Man Open Team with a total of 20 fish and 1,606 points. 2 Man Open Team was won by Neil Bryant and Ray Barron. The 4 Man Executive Team was won by Neil Bryant, Gary Dennis, Ken Smith and Cliff Newbold with 17 fish for 1,256 points.

## **English Shore Championship 2017**

This year's event took place at Eastbourne and had a good entry of 25 anglers fished the 2 days of 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> April 2017.

**Day 1** It soon became apparent that the fishing was not as good as it was a couple of weeks ago. Newcomer to EFSA Jamie Morton landed a sizable 5 bearded rockling when retrieving the first cast of the day, but unfortunately for her that was the only sizable fish to her rod for the day. Other than a lot of undersize whiting, there were a lot of species but just the odd one or two of each. Local angler Paul Parsons showed us the way on day 1 with 5 fish for 136cm to convincingly win his zone. The other zone winner was Barrie Senior with 2 fish for 49cm. One other person had 2 fish with the remaining anglers to hand in a scoring card having just the 1 fish.

Day 2 Today the venue was Pevensey beach and an easy walk from the car park close by. The sun shone and with the wind changed to more from the south and a bit of a chop on the coloured water, thoughts were that maybe today would be better, but it was to be a very scratchy as day one with the 2 zone winners Kim Bowden and Dave Lovelock being the only 2 anglers to get 2 fish while 7 other anglers had 1 fish each. Of the top 4 anglers from day one only 1 caught on day 2 as well. So it was all change for the top 3 positions with the top 3 and pin winners. These were the only three to catch fish on both days, with the rest of the competitors catching a sizable fish or two on only one of the days.

Presentation of awards was carried out by Kim Bowden and Barrie Senior. Kim Bowden presented the pins except to Peter Neal who asked that Jim Whippy present his silver pin in recognition of their 36 years of fishing together. Barrie Senior concluded by giving thanks go to Eastbourne Angling Association for the use of their club premises, to Anglers Den at Pevensey for supplying the good quality bait and to Jim Whippy for pegging the beaches.

Kim Bowden closed by thanking all for attending and hoped to see them on the beach later on this year at the EFSA European Shore in the Netherlands or at next year English Shore. We hope to have a venue soon for that event, so look out on the web site

### **EFSA English Boat Championship 2017**

The EFSA England Boat Championship 2017 was fished out of Poole with 48 anglers competing for the pins over the two days on six boats

On day one it was windy, but not enough to stop some of the boats getting reasonably far offshore to find rays, tope, dogfish and strap conger. Inshore, flatties and gurnards were caught with bream being caught on the majority of marks. At the end of the day with a tie on one boat there were seven anglers on 100%.

Day two and the wind had increased and most boats stayed inshore. Fishing was hard and with the wind stronger than the tide a lot of anglers found themselves under the boat for a large part of the day and catches were reduced. With three boat winners on one boat the chances of two boat wins were severely reduced. Back ashore only one of the previous day winners had managed a second win.

Chairman Neil Bryant was that angler and the winner of the gold pin. In second place and silver pin winner was Gary Galbraith with 198%. Bronze pin went to John Filsell with 191.23%

### EFSA European Boat, Maloy, 2017

Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> July and the opening ceremony took place with a walk from the HQ hotel through the town of Maloy down to the quay where the flag bearers continued onto the large pontoon where the ferry berths. Here they walked the step to the upper level to parade the flags. The opening speeches were delivered from the top deck and with the Championship declared open the EFSA flag was raised next to the Norwegian flag and the local helpers on the stair and top deck each let off a flare - quite a show with the light and smoke from the flares. Later that evening there was a welcome reception at the Best Western HQ hotel where there was also information on the weeks fishing and a chance to ask any questions if not certain on any of the arrangements for the fishing.

Monday morning and the Championship got under way. There were 100 anglers competing. The fishing was on commercial boats with between 4 and 6 on a boat, though you could not be sure till getting on your boat as to your fishing positions as it all depended on space between the structure of the vessels which were all different. Once out of the Harbour the boats could go north or south as Maloy is situated on an island connected to mainland Norway by a bridge, though most of us arrived by ferry direct from Bergen to Maloy. The fishing was mixed, with the 20 boats having a lot of varied water to fish from and with some having more knowledge than others. All fishing was to be on the drift. I can't say a lot about my 4 days fishing as on 4 different boats but all fished the same area and the fishing was not good on any of them with most of the time spent in 100 to 150 meters depth.

The boats I was on were won with between just 7 and 13 fish and with nothing over about 3kg. Each day back on the quay total fish catch had to be weighed in this Championship and each angler had to take his fish box to be weighed and also for heaviest fish. Most days the boxes from my boat you could still see the bottom of the box, though there were fish to be caught and large ones at that. Other boats were coming in with each angler having a full box with fish of 8kg or more amongst them.

Mark Smith was good enough to send me a few words on how his fishing went and recounted his practice day on the Saturday. I went out with others on the Friday but with the wind and rain it was hard to fish so we came back early. This gave a couple of us a chance to buy a better waterproof along with some tackle as there was a shop in Maloy that stocked just about anything to do with the sea and fishing. Many anglers spent a lot of time and money in there. Back to Mark and his practice day on the Saturday. What a different day with light wind and all day sun and some good fishing with large coalfish, haddock, ling, brosme and cod.

Day 1 fishing and Mark was as bad as my boats with the winner having 5 fish. The weather was not very good with a strong wind so lot of boats did not go far. On return to the quay many people had just 1 fish and some people recorded none, which is hard to believe in Norwegian waters.

Tuesdays fishing was moved to Wednesday though some booked a boat and fished in the lee of the land with shelter from the wind and most had a great days with hake to 7 or 8 kg plus other species including megrim and to Mark a ninja lantern shark which despite being small, was not something that had been seen in these waters. Mark's boats got better as the week went on day two he landed 27kg of fish, day three 68kg and day four 72kg. Over the week some of his best fish were haddock of 7 pound, coalfish to 20 pound and cod and ling to 15 pound. Other fish caught in the Championship were pollock, megrim, black mouth dogfish and grey gurnard.

Despite the boats I was on there were many good fish recorded with the heaviest overall to Nigel Hearn with a ling of 18.64kg, the best cod was 14.92kg and many hake recorded with the biggest being 10.74kg.

The presentation of awards was held at the HQ hotel on the Saturday afternoon. The pin winners were all from Norway with Eivind Johannessen gold, second place and silver also on 400% was Petter Skudal. Bronze pin was won by Torunn Handeland on 398 points. Top English individual was Richard Russell in 12<sup>th</sup> place on 358 points which put him in first place in the Senior category. The National teams was as expected with Norway A top and Norway B second.

In the evening it was a short bus ride up the coast to the Raueberg Culture Centre for the Gala dinner and close of the Championship. A good evening was had by all with good food including some of the fish we caught. Entertainment was started with a screen show of highlights of the week and pictures of many of the anglers taking part so people could see themselves on the screen. The screen was also used for a presentation by EFSA Iceland who are hosting the 2018 Boat Championship. Entertainment was provided by a local group who were very good and by a local Elvis impersonator which was well received with his interaction with the audience. The Championship was brought to a close and the EFSA flag was passed to EFSA Iceland.

I think all enjoyed the time spent in Maloy. Some of us expected better fishing but that is the nature of our sport. Certainly the fellow anglers from Norway made us welcome and helped us out with many of the arrangements. Also the people of Maloy certainly made us welcome and we can't blame them for the rain which we saw every day at some time.
