Reports on Events 2024

Fun Fish Sheerness 2024

The day after the AGM 21 members boarded their boats at the All-Tide Landing, Queenborough for an 8 a.m. start to fish for flatfish in the Medway. It was a cold overcast day with a light breeze and calm waters. With black lug and herring for bait the target species, dabs, were soon being caught and there was a steady stream of fish coming aboard throughout the day. Other species caught included a few whiting, 5 bearded rockling, pout and a bass.

The presentation back on shore was delayed by half an hour as one of the boats had broken down and had to be towed back to the Landing. Richard Russell was top dab catcher with 29 fish for 581cm fishing on Dentex. Second place went to Gary Geoghegan on Hurricane with 24 fish for 522cm. Coincidentally, this was the same result for him as the last time we held the Funfish at this venue in 2019. Kim Bowden on Dentex took 3rd spot with 25 fish for 500cm.

Longest dab was 29cm caught by Ray Barron on Dentex.

Congratulations to the winners. Many thanks to the skippers and to Matt Osbourne for arranging the bait.

EFSA Game Championship South Africa

The 2024 event was fished out of Hout Bay, Cape Town, South Africa and took place between the 6th and 10th May 2024. The Championships were excellently organised by SADSAA and the Hout Bay Boat Club. Fishing was only possible on two of the four designated days due to strong winds. Only five anglers caught fish on the first day, but sixteen anglers caught on the second day, with some anglers catching two or three fish. Twenty-seven anglers from eight sections fished on nine boats. The event was won by Iceland with a South African Team second and a Barbarian team third.

European Boat and Line Championships - Weymouth

EFSA England hosted the 2024 Championships at Weymouth with the welcome and opening ceremony being held at the Rembrandt Hotel on Sunday 8th September. A chance to catch up with old friends and get the latest information on the event. It was announced that due to forecasted weather conditions the 2-day Line Class event would take place on Thursday and Friday not Monday and Tuesday as originally planned.

Monday 9th September saw eight boats with 57 anglers aboard head off into the wind and staying inshore. Several boats stopped for mackerel, but they were hard to come by and anchor fishing was difficult as the boats were yawing back and forth in the wind, with some anglers spending a lot of time fishing under the boat. Drifting for wrasse and pollack was easier. At the end of the day there were ten anglers on 100% as on two boats there was a tie for first place. On count back Martin Hubert took the lead with 99 points, Matt Osbourne 2nd with 95 points and Mark Smith 3rd with 79 points.

Tuesday 10th September was again windy with similar fishing to Monday. At the end of the day, it had all changed at the top with only two anglers managing another boat win and 200%. On count back Didier Marest took top spot with 158 points from Petter Skudal, last year's champion, on 151 points. In third place was Francis Couzinet with 198.68 %

Wednesday 11th September saw the wind easing becoming more off the land, so a more comfortable fish but boats did not venture too far out. So again, similar fishing, bream wrasse, pout, gurnards, dogfish, conger and rays made up most of the catches. Didier held on to his top place with another boat win so a total of 300%. Francis Couzinet had a boat win to put him on 296% for second place and Torrun Handeland moved up into third spot with 291.46%.

Thursday 12th September was Day 1 of the 2-Day Light Line event with each competitor having to use the 30lb braid supplied for the event. The results for this event would also be added into the main Boat Championship. The wind had eased, and the boats were able to get out to the 3 Mile Bank where anglers would be targeting larger fish; conger eel, tope, rays and any other fish over 5lbs. Although the fishing was easier, we had rain showers, some heavy and squally with a waterspout being spotted at one point. With nine anglers on 100% it was down to count back to decide positions.

Leading with 270 points was Nico Opdebeeck, second was Heiko Dreier with 190 points and 3rd Jason Williams also with 190 points, but two less fish. Meanwhile in the Boat Championship it was all change, with the leaders all having a bad day. Heiko Dreier moved up into first place with 389.61%. In second place was Mark Smith with 367% and third was Ray Barron with 326%.

Friday 13^t September saw the final day of the Championships with all to play for in both the Light Line and the Boat Championships. It was a nice sunny day and lighter winds so back to the 3 Mile Bank for more big fish. In the Evening, the Gala Dinner and presentation were held at the Rembrandt Hotel. Andy Selby announced the results and the prizes were presented by the Mayor of Weymouth Councilor Jon Orrell and Marcus Wuest

First the Line Class awards were presented with the gold pin going to Mark Smith, Carl Julien the silver and Michael Lorenzen the bronze.

Top lady in the Line Class was Jacqueline Luef from South Africa with Torunn Handeland second.

After the Line Class results had been added to the previous three days it was a re-run of the Light Line event with Mark Smtih the overall winner of the Boat Championship taking his second gold pin of the evening, Carl Julien the silver and Michael Lorenzen the bronze.

Top Lady was Torunn Handeland with Jacqueline Luef second.

Top Senior was Paul Hart with Torunn Handeland second and Barrie Senior third. The National Teams event was won by England A, with France second and Denmark third.

European Species Championship - Langeland - Denmark

The event was hosted by EFSA Germany and started with the opening ceremony on Sunday evening 6th October 2024 at Hotel Rudkøbing Skudehavn. This event was the first competition where competitors would be fishing from self-drive boats and not from charter boats with the target species flatfish. As this was a first for EFSA, Marcus Wuest gave a detailed explanation of how it would work. He then answered questions from the competitors and clarified procedures. Following this there was a buffet for the anglers to enjoy.

Monday was a designated practice day to enable the skippers of each boat plus the anglers to familiarise themselves with fishing in the small boats, but unfortunately, the weather had other ideas and the practice was postponed to Tuesday. Fortunately, there was a spare day in the program to enable the event to be fished over two days.

Tuesday. The weather was better, but not great, and practice went ahead with some showers and a strong wind. The strong winds meant that the drift was too fast and also the direction of it kept pushing the boats off of the preferred grounds so there was a lot of moving around. Fish were caught but not in any numbers.

Day One Wednesday

The wind had decreased and we had a fair amount of sunshine with only a couple of very light showers. The fishing was good with the top anglers catching over one hundred flatfish. Lars Hellum finished the day in top place with 122 points. In second place was Gary Geoghegan with 115 points and third was Charlie Lara with 111 points.

Day Two - Thursday

The weather deteriorated slightly, but with an offshore wind we were able to fish. The fishing was harder and the results reflected this.

The presentation took place that evening at Hotel Rudkøbing Skudehavn followed by the Gala Dinner.

Lars Hellum remained in the top spot, having again been the top angler on the second day. He took first place and the gold pin with a total of 210 points. In second place with 189 points and winning the silver pin was Charlie Lara. Third place and bronze pin went to Andre Martinsen with 186 points.

In the national team event Norway A were first with 637 points, England A second with 560 points and Gibraltar A third with 518 points.

The top Senior was Gary Geoghan with 182 points.

The best fish prize was shared between Matt Osborne, Andy Smith and Mark van Wanrooy all having a 43cm fish.
